## 1. Serengeti National Park

Tanzania's oldest national park. Home to the big five; estimated two million wildebeest, 250,000 zebra and 450,000 thomson's gazelles. A top attraction of the Serengeti is the annual migration of the wildebeest.

## 2. Ngorongoro National Park

Hosts the big game, including the Big Five. The crater is home to strong populations of lion, leopard and hyena along with herds of wildebeest, buffalo and zebra. Other game includes serval cat, cheetah, jackal.

## 3. Tarangire National Park

Gently rolling landscape with a scattering of a good number of baobab trees and abandoned termite mounds; particularly attractive to elephant lovers with over 3500 elephants.

## 4. Arusha National Park

Offers spectacular views of Mt Kilimanjaro; landscape consists of rolling hills, coniferous forests and small craters and lakes; famous for the rare acrobatic black and white colobus monkey; ideal park for outdoor enthusiasts: hiking, canoeing, mountain biking and even climbing allowed.

## 5. Lake Manyara National Park

Lush, green and truly spectacular; two thirds of the park covered by a salty water lake; birding area with over 400 species; troops of several hundred baboons can often be seen.

## 6. Selous National Park

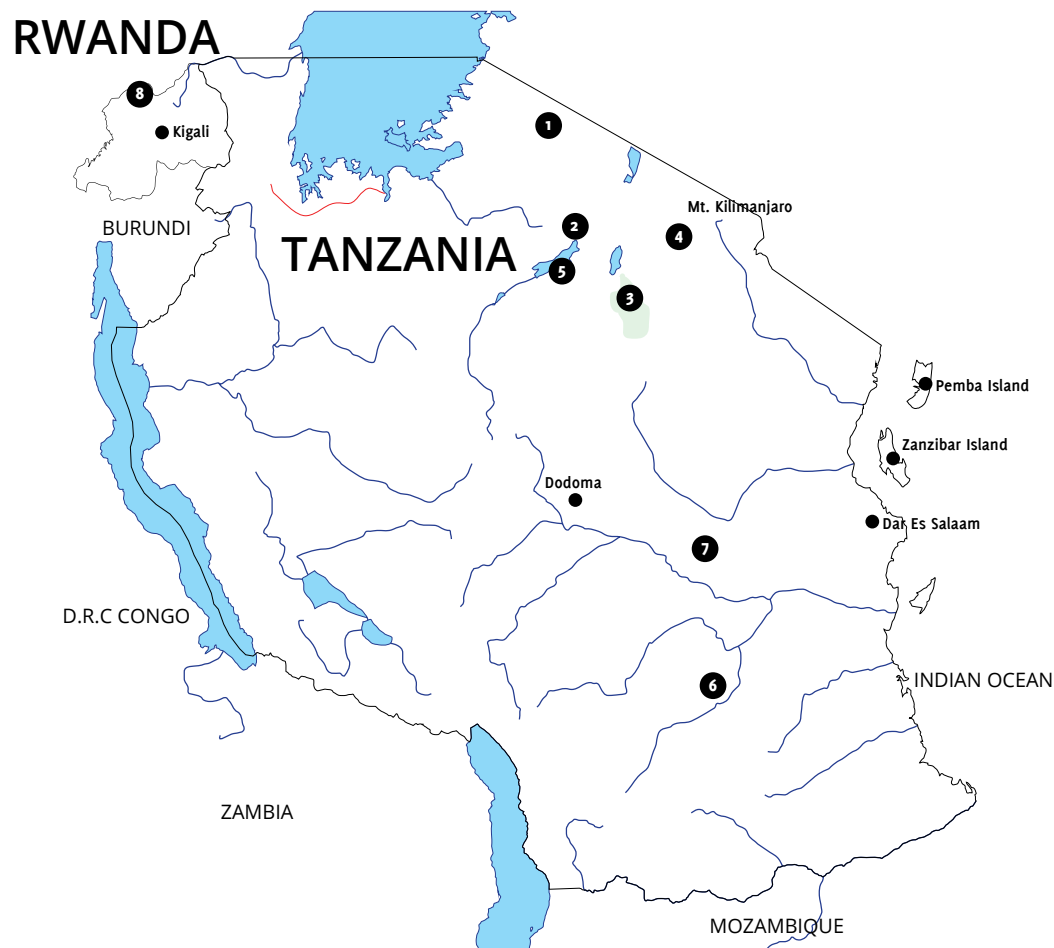
The rivers and lakes are the bloodlife of the park that is home to elephant, wild dog, buffalo, hippo, crocodile, leopard and lion. The park hosts over 50% of the remaining endangered African wild dog. It also hosts buffalos, giraffes, elands, hyenas, sables, hippos, crocodiles, kudus, wildebeests, hartebeests, colobus and velvet monkeys along with over 450 species of birds.

## 7. Mikumi National Park

Main feature is the Mikumi flood plain, along with the mountain ranges that border the park. Mikumi covers an area of 3,230 sq km, and is rich in wildlife: buffalo, wildebeest, zebra, lion, elephant, impala, hippos, baboon, giraffe, warthog, waterbuck and eland. Reptiles including crocodile, monitor lizard and python are also resident in the park. Other animals that can be sighted although rare are the Sable Antelope, Greater Kudu, leopard, and the wild dog. More than 400 bird species have been recorded.

## 8. Volcanoes National Park

Volcanoes National Park is a stop centre for all Rwanda gorilla safaris sheltering the highest number of mountain gorillas in the Virunga Conservation area. It's also home to the golden monkeys. Five of the eight volcanoes of the Virunga Mountains (Karisimbi, Bisoke, Muhabura, Gahinga and Sabyinyo), are located here.



### 1. Lake Turkana

Lake Turkana is the world's largest desert lake, and it holds one of the longest and famous histories on earth. In proximity to Sibiloi National Park with prehistoric petrified forests. It is also Kenya's most remote place.

### 2. Marsabit National Park

Marsabit National Park - forested mountain and three crater lakes - the region's only permanent water source. Marsabit National Park is the last refuge of the huge-tusked bull elephants.

### 3. South Turkana National Reserve

South Turkana National Reserve is a rugged and very beautiful expanse of land with very few visitors consisting of dense thorn bushes and riverine forests, the landscape has a great variety, especially away from the seasonal riverbeds.

### 4. Kerio Valley

4,000ft deep, semi-tropical vegetation on the slopes, dry thorn bush at the base. Impressive views, rich bird life and wildlife population including elephants and leopards.

### 5-6. Lakes Baringo and Bogoria

Baringo, a freshwater lake has over 460 bird species. Nearby Soda Lake Bogoria hosts thousands of flamingos and other birds. Famous for hot springs and geysers.

### 7. Kakamega Forest

The only tropical rain forest in Kenya, over 360 species of birds, 380 species of plants, 400 species of butterflies, 7 species of primates and others.

### 8-9. Samburu & Buffalo Springs

The Samburu National Reserve is a game reserve on the banks of the Ewaso Nyiro river in Kenya. On the other side of the river is the Buffalo Springs National Reserve. The park covers an area of 165 km<sup>2</sup>.

### 11. Masai Mara

The Masai Mara is the most famous game reserve in Kenya - famous for the abundance of lion, the Great Wildebeest Migration and the Masai people - see page 4

### 12. Lake Nakuru National Park

Lake Nakuru National Park is located at a distance of 160 km from Nairobi. The national park is famous for its tens of thousands of flamingos but suffers from high water levels. The park is still host to some flamingos and other mammals but has lost attractiveness.

### 13. Hells Gate National Park

Located in proximity to Naivasha with red tinged cliffs; steam vents and bubbling springs; plains game and birdlife. Walking is permitted in the park, making it ideal for hiking, biking, and rock climbing.

### 14. Mount Longonot National Park

Young volcano, 2,776 metres high; beautifully shaped valleys and ridges; lonesome steam vent to the northeast impenetrable forest in the crater.

### 18. Meru National Park

Stunning, less visited; diverse scenery from woodlands to wide open plains. 13 rivers and numerous mountain-fed streams - home to the Big Five and over 300 species of birds.

### 19. Amboseli National Park

Located in Southwestern Kenya bordering Tanzania. Most famous for its most breathtaking views of the Kilimanjaro and big herds of elephants.

### 20. Chyulu Hills

Rarely visited; truly magical area of ragged craters, rolling grassland, exotic aromatic plants and cedar forests; plenty of game in the woodland savannah on the western, lower slopes.

### 26. Murchison Falls National Park

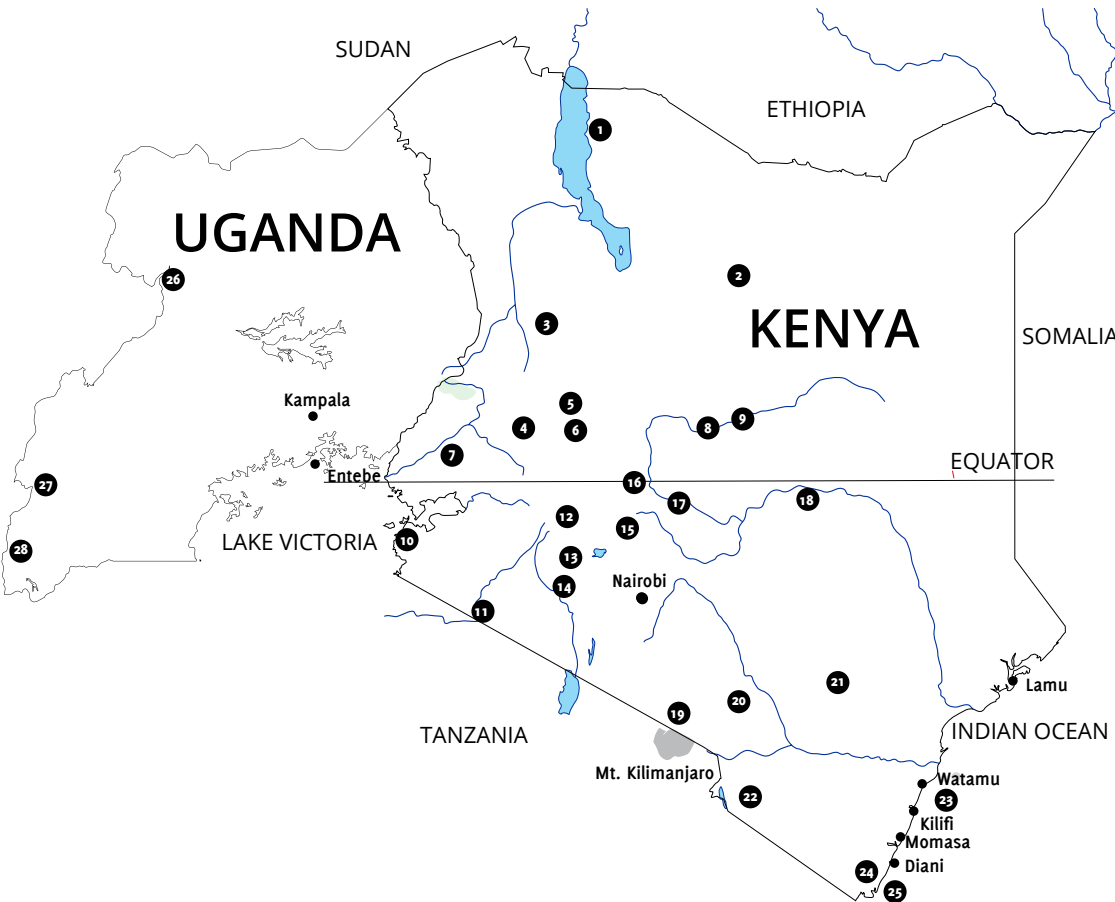
Park wildlife includes elephants and hippos, and there are chimpanzees in the Kaniyo Pabidi mahogany forest.

### 27. Queen Elizabeth National Park

Uganda's most popular tourist destination. The park's diverse ecosystems, which include, sparkling lakes, big game, ten primate species including chimpanzees and over 600 species of birds.

### 28. Bwindi Impenetrable National Park

It's home to many mountain gorillas. Restricted numbers of viewing permits help protect the endangered gorillas. Rough paths weave amid dense forests, which are home to many butterflies and birds.



## MASAI MARA

The Masai Mara National Reserve covers an area of 1,510 sq km and borders Tanzania and the Serengeti National Park. The landscape varies from vast savannahs and riverine forests with clumps of the distinctive acacia trees.

The Mara is without doubt Africa's most legendary safari destination - famous for breathtaking vistas, abundant wildlife and endless plains. Here is the place to witness the incredible annual wildebeest migration with the spectacular river crossings between July and October as over two million wildebeest, zebras and other antelopes thunder across the plains in search of water and grazing.

The Mara is an all year attraction - holding one of the highest lion densities in the world, being home to Kenya's Big 5: elephant, buffalo, leopard, lion and rhino - amongst over 95 mammal species and 570 recorded species of birds.

The Mara can be accessed by road from Nairobi by Air both scheduled or charter flights from either Nairobi or Mombasa.

## 3 DAYS/2 NIGHTS MASARI MARA ROAD OR FLYING SAFARI



*Phoenix Safaris offers this safari by road from Nairobi or by air from Nairobi and several coastal airports. Extra nights can be booked as well - we recommend a stay of three nights especially during the great migration (July - October) to fully enjoy the experience.*

### Day 1

Pick up in Nairobi early morning hours and drive to Mara Siria Camp, alternatively flight from Nairobi Wilson or coastal airport to Masai Mara, transfer to the

camp for check-in & lunch, afternoon game drive, dinner and overnight at Mara Siria Camp

### Day 2

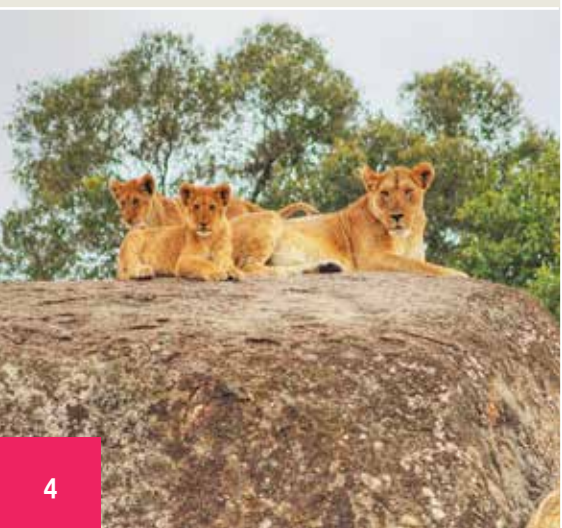
Morning and afternoon game drive with lunch at the camp or full day game drive with picnic, dinner and overnight Mara Siria Camp

### Day 3

Morning game drive (optional), drive or flight back to Nairobi

## MARA SIRIA CAMP & COTTAGES

Situated North West of the Mara. on top of the Siria Escarpment. The eco-friendly camp is solar powered and offers stunning views and a very authentic safari experience with only 12 tents and 2 cottages. Each room has comfortable furnishing, a private terrace and an en-suite bathroom with hot safari shower. Facilities include a lounge, viewing platforms, a restaurant, a wine cellar and a plunge pool. The camp is not fenced, zebras and giraffes are regular visitors.



## LOITA HILLS & PLAINS

The Loita Hills are a low-lying mountain range located Northeast of the Masai Mara. This area is rarely visited and traditional Masai culture still exists here. There are pockets of remote forests, wide open plains surrounded by the stunning hillsides and dotted with roaming wildlife. A peaceful place to begin or end a safari trip in Kenya with a very unique and authentic encounter.

*On the mountain bike guests will cover approx. 20 to 30 km and on foot approx. 10 to 20 km a day. Anyone in an average physical condition can participate - the route can be slightly adjusted if need be. Guests will learn and see the way of the Masai in a very unique way - they will be sharing their knowledge and stories of the areas you'll pass. Guests have full vehicle support and a team for your comfort and safety. Each day the camp will be set to meet guests on the way, ready with freshly prepared meals. The camps are set in the beautiful surroundings of African wilderness - they are quite basic, but equipped with everything necessary that you might expect from these rough surroundings.*



### Day 1

Pick up in Nairobi and drive to Maji Moto, lunch, meet your guides, unwind at the camp and explore the plains on a guided walk, dinner, visit the hot springs and take a relaxing bath, overnight at Maji Moto Eco Camp

### Day 2

Start the trek/cycle through open savanna - spot gazelles, zebras and wildebeest on the way. Today's bush camp will be set in the forest, next to a natural spring

### Day 3

Depart deep into Loita Hills through savannas, bushes and acacia forests. You will cross rivers and track wild game. The amazing scenery here is full of wildlife like antelopes, giraffes, elephants, buffaloes and even the big cats. Your second bush camp will be set under the shed of significant yellow bark acacia trees

### Day 4

Your last day of your tour on foot/bicycle will lead you towards the Masai Mara. By noon you should meet with your safari vehicle not far from the gate with picnic

lunch, drive to Mara Siria Camp and watch game en-route, dinner and overnight Mara Siria Camp

### Day 5

Morning and afternoon game drives with lunch at the camp or full day game drive with picnic lunch. Dinner and overnight at Mara Siria Camp

### Day 6

Early morning game drive, then drive back to Nairobi

## MAJI MOTO ECO CAMP

Nestled on a hilltop in Masai lands and overlooking vast savannah plains, Maji Moto is an environmentally-sensitive simple camp built in Masai-style using local materials. Candles, lanterns and camp fire are used for light in the evening. Six igloo-type tents are furnished with mattresses, pillows and bedding. The bathrooms contain toilet and a warm shower. Activities like guided nature walks, mountain biking, cultural experiences, school visit and hot spring visit are included.





## SOLIO RANCH

The 17,500-acre reserve, 22 km north of Nyeri Town, plays a major part in the protection and breeding black rhinos in Kenya. The rhino is a member of the 'Big-Five', which are a key tourist attraction. Solio Ranch is recognised as one of the most successful private rhino breeding reserves in Kenya. The animals live in harmony with other wildlife, including the buffalo, zebra, giraffe and plains game such as eland, oryx, impala.



## OL PEJETA CONSERVANCY

Located in the Laikipia Region directly on the equator. It has the highest density of wildlife in Kenya, with the largest population of black and white rhino in East Africa and is also home to Barraka the blind and tame black rhino. Situated within the reserve is Sweetwaters Chimpanzee Sanctuary. Amongst other animals that can be seen are elephants, lions, leopards, buffaloes, rhinos, cheetahs, grevy's zebra, jackson's wildebeest.



## SAMBURU RESERVE

Samburu is rich in wildlife with an abundance of rare northern specialist species such as the grevy's zebra, somali ostrich, reticulated giraffe, gerenuk and the beisa oryx. Many leopards live in the northern part, where the river flows through rocky hills and a narrow plain, There are more than 400 species of birds including the somali ostrich. You can spot lions, cheetahs, leopards and elephants.

### Day 1

Pick up in Nairobi in the morning, Drive to Rhino Watch Lodge for lunch, afternoon visit Solio Ranch for game drive, dinner and overnight Rhino Watch Lodge - be assured to spot the black rhinos

### Day 2

Morning visit to Aberdare Game Sanctuary for a guided walk, then drive to Samburu, arrival for lunch, afternoon game drive, dinner and overnight Samburu Game Lodge

### Day 3

Morning and afternoon game drive with lunch at the lodge, dinner and overnight Samburu Game Lodge

### Day 4

Drive to Ol Pejeta with en-route game drive, arrival for lunch, afternoon game drive with visit at the chimpanzee sanctuary, dinner and overnight Serena Sweetwaters Camp

### Day 5

Morning Game Drive, Drive back to Nairobi (lunch not included)

### ↓ SWEETWATERS TENTED CAMP

The camp has 39 luxury tents inside Ol Pejeta Conservancy with en-suite bathroom and a private veranda facing a waterhole where many animals come to drink day and night. The restaurant offers regional and international cuisine. The Waterhole Bar, built in the style of a game viewing hide, overlooks the waterhole and offers unrivaled wildlife-watching. For a relaxing treat at the end of a long day, try swimming, sunbathing or a treatment at the Maisha Spa.





## ↑ SAMBURU SOPA LODGE

Built atop high ground allowing panoramic views. Consists of fifteen cottages, each with two bedrooms, restaurant & bar, a pool and a waterhole.

## ↓ RHINO WATCH LODGE

Situated in the Central Kenyan Highlands close to Nyeri and the Solio Ranch. 7 chalets and 8 tents. Facilities include a restaurant, a spa with sauna, a library, diverse sitting areas and an infinity pool.



## LAKE TURKANA

The UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE, is widely known as the Jade Sea, because of the remarkable, almost incandescent, colour of its waters. Turkana has one of the longest living histories on earth, and recent fossil evidence unearthed at Koobi Fora has led to the Lake being referred to as 'The Cradle of Mankind'. Central Island is breeding ground of the world's biggest population of Nile Crocodiles with an estimated number of 12,000 animals living here.



## Day 1

Arrival in Kenya, transfer and overnight Four Points Sheraton

## Day 2

Flight to Lodwar, lunch, afternoon fishing with Turkana fishermen, tasting of traditionally prepared fish, dinner and overnight Eliye Springs

## Day 3

Visit Moite, watch waterbirds and crocodiles, lunch, boat trip to Central Island, visit the Flamingo crater, boat trip around the island, dinner and "open air night" in special mosquito tents

## Day 4

Trekking to the crocodile crater, breakfast, return to the lodge for lunch, sun-downer boat trip on the lake

## Day 5

Full day excursion to the "Turkana Boy", visit the fishermen around the Ferguson Golf, dinner and overnight Eliye Springs

## Day 6

Transfer to Lodwar, flight to Nairobi

## ↓ ELIYE SPRINGS RESORT

Eliye Springs is at present the only beach resort on Lake Turkana, located on the western shores, offering amazing views of Lake Turkana. It comprises a total of 21 rooms with 6 luxury Turkana bomas with en-suite bathroom and private terrace. The on-site restaurant offers continental and local dishes, the lounge and bar area serves a variety of soft drinks and choice wines and liquors. The resort also offers a natural swimming pool with thermal waters from the springs.





## AMBOSELI

Amboseli National Park is located in Southwestern Kenya covering an area of 392km<sup>2</sup> only - offering best views of Mount Kilimanjaro. Africa's tallest free-standing mountain rises just across the border in Tanzania. Amboseli has a postcard-perfect view of its snow-capped peaks. A population of over 1,000 elephants reside in the parks eco-system. Amboseli is an area of low scrubby vegetation and open grassy plains -ideal for game viewing.



## SAMBURU RESERVE

Samburu forms a unit with Buffalo Springs and Shaba Reserve. All three are located on the Ewaso Nyiro River. In the north the landscape is dry and the savannah is broken by low mountain slopes. Samburu is rich in wildlife with an abundance of rare northern specialist species such as the Grevy zebra, Somali ostrich, reticulated giraffe, gerenuk and the Oryx (also known as Samburu Five). You can also find more than 400 species of birds including the Somali ostrich. You can as well spot lions, leopards and elephants, & maybe a rhino.



## MASAI MARA RESERVE

Masai Mara National Reserve covers an area of 1,510 sq km and borders Tanzania's Serengeti. The landscape varies from vast savannas and riverine forests with clumps of the distinctive acacia trees. The Mara is an all year attraction - holding one of the highest lion densities in the world, being home to Kenya's Big 5: elephant, buffalo, leopard, lion and rhino - amongst over 95 mammal species and 570 species of birds.



### Day 1

Pick up at JKI Airport, overnight at Weston Hotel near Wilson Airport

### Day 2

Transfer to Wilson Airport, flight to Amboseli, lunch, afternoon game drive, dinner and overnight at Amboseli Serena Safari Lodge

### Day 3

Morning and afternoon game drive, lunch, dinner and overnight at Amboseli Serena

### Day 4

Flight from Amboseli to Nairobi-Wilson and onward to Samburu, lunch, afternoon game drive, dinner and overnight at Elephant Bedroom Camp

### Day 5

Morning and afternoon game drives with lunch, dinner and overnight at Elephant Bedroom Camp

### Day 6

Optional Nature Walk or Early morn-







ing game drive, flight via Nairobi to Ma-sai Mara, check-in and lunch, afternoon game drive, dinner and overnight at Mara Siria Camp

**Day 7**

Morning and afternoon game drive or full day game drive with lunch/picnic, dinner and overnight at Mara Siria Camp

**Day 8**

Morning game drive, flight back to Nairobi, transfer to JKIA Airport

**AMBOSELI SERENA LODGE**

The Lodge is located on the foothills of Kilimanjaro, hidden beneath a copse of giant acacia trees and beside a gently flowing natural spring. The lodges' design itself draws on Masai cultural motifs, featuring natural woodcarvings, traditional artifacts and colorful local art. The lodge has 96 rooms - all with views of the park. Other facilities include a restaurant, a bar and a swimming pool filled with fresh water from a spring flowing from Mount Kilimanjaro.

**ELEPHANT BEDROOM CAMP**

The camp is not fenced and set on the banks of the Ewaso Nyiro River inside Samburu. The 12 spacious en-suite luxury tents are furnished in elegant African style terrace and private plunge pool. Dining is a culinary experience with three course lunch and five-course, candlelit dinner. Lounge and dining area are set in vibrant safari colours with original paintings and soft lighting. Private meals can be arranged. Herds of elephants are regular visitors around the camp.

**MARA SIRIA CAMP & COTTAGES**

Situated North West of the Mara. on top of the Siria Escarpment. ## AMBOSELI

Located in Southwestern Kenya, crowned by Mount Kilimanjaro, Africa's highest peak, the Amboseli National Parks is one of Kenya's most popular parks. The name "Amboseli" comes from a Masai word meaning "salty dust", and it is one of the best places in Africa to view large herds of elephants up close. The landscape varies from the dried-up bed of Lake Amboseli, wetlands with Sulphur springs, the savannah and woodlands.



## TSAVO WEST

Tsavo West National Park is an area of 9,065 km<sup>2</sup>. The Nairobi-Mombasa highway and a railway divides it from the adjoining Tsavo East National Park. Together with adjoining ranches and protected areas, they comprise the Tsavo Conservation Area. The savannah ecosystem comprises of open grasslands, scrublands, and Acacia woodlands, belts of riverine vegetation and rocky ridges. Attractions include the Mzima Springs, Shetani lava flows, animals, diverse plant and bird species.



## TSAVO EAST

Tsavo East National Park is covering an area of 13,747 km<sup>2</sup> - the largest protected area in Kenya. Tsavo East is flat, dry with open savannah which makes game viewing easier. Across the river is the incredible 300 kilometer long (186 mile) Yatta Plateau, the longest lava flow in the world. The park is home to most of the larger mammals, vast herds of dust-red elephant and bird life featuring 500 recorded species.

## 6 DAYS/5 NIGHTS AMBOSELI & TSAVO SAFARI



### Day 1

Pick up in Nairobi, drive to Tsavo West with en-route game drive, lunch, afternoon game drive, dinner and overnight at Kilguni Serena Lodge

### Day 2

Drive to Tsavo East with en-route game drive at Ngutuni Conservancy, lunch, afternoon game drive, dinner and overnight at Ngutuni Safari Lodge

### Day 3

Games drive with lunch at the lodge, dinner, night game drive, overnight Ngutuni Safari Lodge

### Day 4

Drive to Amboseli, lunch, afternoon game drive, dinner and overnight at Kibo Safari Camp

### Day 5

Games drive with lunch at the camp, dinner and overnight at Kibo Camp

### Day 6

Early morning game drive, breakfast, drive back to Nairobi

*This safari can also be booked from Mombasa and it can end either in Nairobi or Mombasa - the visiting order of the park might change.*

### ↓ KIBO SAFARI CAMP

Set only five min. drive from the entry gate, offering great views of Mt. Kilimanjaro. The 71 tents are furnished with African rustic furniture and have a private terrace. Other facilities include an open restaurant, a bar and a swimming pool.





# MOUNT KENYA & MOUNT KILIMANJARO TREKS

## ▲ NGUTUNI SAFARI LODGE

The Lodge has 48 en-suite rooms. Private balconies overlook the water hole, ideal for evening and night game viewing. Facilities include a bar and a restaurant.

## ▼ KILAGUNI SERENA LODGE

Ideally placed for visits to all the prime attractions. All 56 en-suite rooms have their own verandas, some overlooking the waterhole, some the Chyulu Hills. Facilities include a pool, bar and a restaurant.



## MOUNT KENYA

Located in Central Kenya, just north of the equator. Mount Kenya's peak is 5,199 meters, the second tallest in Africa. The scenery surrounding this designated World Heritage Site is breathtaking. It is pristine wilderness with lakes, tarns, glaciers, dense forest, mineral springs and a selection of rare and endangered species of animals, high altitude adapted plains game and unique montane and alpine vegetation. Visitors can enjoy mountain climbing, camping and caving.

## MOUNT KILIMANJARO

Located in Northern Tanzania, its summit is 5,895 meters, making it the tallest in Africa. It has three main volcanic peaks, Kibo, Mawenzi, and Shira. The mountain's ecosystems are varied and diverse. On the lowland slopes, much of the mountain is farmland. Thick lowland forest covers the lower altitudes and breaks into alpine meadows once the air begins to thin. Near the peak, the landscape is harsh and barren, with rocks and ice the predominant features.

## MT KENYA - Sirimon Route

### Day 1

Pick up in Nairobi and drive to Naromoru. The hike starts at 2600m and takes 3 to 4 hours. Dinner and overnight Met station at 3,000m

### Day 2

The trail is longer and steeper, (1200m spread over 10 km) which can take 5 to 6 hours. After about an hour you get past the forest belt into the moorland. Stop for lunch at scenic rocks, then hike up to Teleki Hut for dinner and overnight

### Day 3

Ascent to Point Lenana. After a short flat stretch you trek over frozen scree, then follow a ridge all the way to the summit. Have spectacular views before descending via the Simba Cole to the Shiptons camp for lunch, dinner and overnight

### Day 4

After breakfast you embark on a 17 km descend to Old Moses Camp. Arrive for lunch, meet your driver guide and drive back to Nairobi

## MT KILIMANJARO - Marangu Route

### Day 1

Drive to Marangu Gate, 4 hours hike to Mandara Hut, weather permitting short walk to Maundi Crater

### Day 2

Today's hike trail to Horombo Hut is strenuous but not technical

### Day 3

Acclimatization day - hiking up towards Mawenzi, overnight Horombo Hut

### Day 4

Long hike up to Kibo Hut. The last part of the trail passes across the plateau before a final ascent to Kibo Hut

### Day 5

Hike towards Gillman's point to the summit, Uhuru Peak (5895m). Descend to Horombo Hut for the night

### Day 6

Descend to Marangu Gate to end the tour

## 5 DAYS/4 NIGHTS SERENGETI & NGORONGORO SAFARI

### NGORONGORO

The Ngorongoro Conservation Area is located in Northern Tanzania. It's home to the vast, volcanic Ngorongoro Crater and "big 5" game (elephant, lion, leopard, buffalo and rhino). Huge herds of wildebeests and zebras traverse its plains during their annual migration. Livestock belonging to the semi-nomadic Masai tribe graze alongside wild animals. Hominin fossils found in the Olduvai Gorge date back millions of years.



### SERENGETI

The Serengeti National Park is known for its annual migration of wildebeest and zebra. Many cross the marshy western corridor's crocodile-infested Grumeti River. Others veer northeast to the Lobo Hills, home to black eagles. Black rhinos inhabit the granite outcrops of the Moru Kopjes. With an estimated two million wildebeest, 250,000 zebra and 450,000 Thomson's gazelles there is also an excellent chance to see a chase and even a kill. The park covers 14,763 km<sup>2</sup>.



#### Day 1

Pick up at Kilimanjaro International Airport, picnic lunch on the way, afternoon crater rim walk, dinner and overnight at Rhino Lodge

#### Day 2

After breakfast start for the crater game drive 2000ft down the crater, tracking animals and enjoying a picnic lunch. After this you will have an en-route game drive to the Serengeti, dinner and overnight at Katikati Tented Camp

#### Day 3

Morning game drive, return to the lodge for lunch, enjoy your afternoon game drive, dinner and overnight at Katikati Tented Camp

#### Day 4

En-route Game Drive and drive to Karatu with picnic lunch. Guided afternoon walk in the coffee farms, dinner and overnight at Ngorongoro Farm House Valley.

#### Day 5

Drive to Kilimanjaro Airport to catch your international flight

### NGORONGORO RHINO LODGE

Ideally located on the edge of the Ngorongoro crater rim, Rhino Lodge offers a perfect base from which to explore the Ngorongoro crater and its surroundings. The Lodge was originally the home of Ngorongoro's first conservator, and its developers have maintained the house's original rustic, low-impact style and natural setting. The lodge offers 24 rooms, a cozy living space, friendly staff and African-inspired meals. Each room has its own bathroom and wood-burning stoves.



### ↑ KATIKATI TENTED CAMP

Kati Kati is a mobile camp strategically situated in central Serengeti, ideal for exploring the extensive Serengeti plains. The camp has all the commodities of today.

### ↓ FARM HOUSE VALLEY

Farm House Valley Lodge, located within a 500 acre coffee farm in Karatu. Has 31 spacious en suite rooms, Each room has two entrances, and a small balcony. Facilities include a swimming pool and lounge area.



## SELOUS

The Selous Game Reserve is a protected area in southern Tanzania. It covers a total area of 50,000 km<sup>2</sup> and has additional buffer zones. Some of the typical wildlife of the miombo inhabits the reserve, such as African bush elephant, black rhino, hippopotamus, lion, East African wild dog, Cape buffaloes, Masai giraffe, Plains zebra, and Nile crocodile. Habitats include grassland, typical Acacia savanna, wetlands and extensive Miombo woodlands.

## MIKUMI

Mikumi is Tanzania's fourth-largest national park with 3,230 sq km (1,250 sq miles). It's also the most accessible from Dar es Salaam. The park has a wide variety of wildlife including The Big Five that can be easily spotted and also well acclimatized to game viewing. Hippo pools provide close access to the mud-loving beasts, and bird-watching along the waterways. Mikumi National Park borders the Selous Game Reserve and Udzungwa National Park.



# 5 DAYS/4 NIGHTS SELOUS & MIKUMI SAFARI



### Day 1

Pickup at you hotel or airport in Dar Es Salaam and drive to Selous Game Reserve with en-route game drive, check-in and lunch, boat safari in the afternoon, dinner and overnight at Africa Safari Camp

### Day 2

Drive through Selous Reserve with en-route game viewing, picnic with packed lunch, dinner and overnight at Sable Mountain Lodge

### Day 3

Drive to Mikumi with en-route game drive, check-in and lunch, game drive in the afternoon, dinner and overnight at Stanely's Kopje

### Day 4

Morning and afternoon game drive with lunch, dinner and overnight at Stanely's Kopje

### Day 5

Early morning game drive, leave Mikumi with packed lunch and drive back to Dar Es Salaam

### ↑ AFRICA SAFARI CAMP

The camp is located at the entrance of Selous Reserve -the Rufiji river is within walking distance. All bungalows and safari tents are equipped with private bathroom with hot water safari showers.

### ↓ STANELY'S KOPJE CAMP

It sits on top of a kopje, or rocky outcrop, overlooking the Mkata floodplain. The camp features 12 tented rooms with a swimming pool.



## 4 DAYS/3 NIGHTS GORILLA SAFARI

Only about 800 mountain gorillas are remaining on earth. Most of them have a wild existence - some of groups have been habituated and can be tracked by small numbers of visitors. We offer gorilla Trekking experiences in Uganda and Rwanda. Uganda has most mountain gorillas - with about 480 gorillas and 19 gorilla groups habituated. Tracking can be done in Bwindi Impenetrable Forest or the easier to trek Mgahinga Gorilla Park. One should be in reasonable shape and state of fitness to track the gorillas. The tour normally takes about 5 hours - it can take up to 7 hours or shorter depending on the location of your gorilla group, the time with the gorillas is limited to one hour per trek.

### BWINDI NATIONAL PARK

Bwindi Impenetrable National Park lies in southwestern Uganda on the edge of the Rift Valley. Its mist-covered hillsides are blanketed by one of Uganda's oldest and most biologically diverse rainforests, which dates back over 25,000 years and contains almost 400 species of plants.



#### Day 1

Arrival in Kigali, pick-up and transfer to Hotel Chez Lando for overnight

#### Day 2

Visit the twin lakes of Bulera & Ruhondo - beautiful lakes located at the base of volcano Muhabura. Cross the border into Uganda and proceed to Bwindi Impenetrable National Park. Dinner and overnight at Silverback Lodge

#### Day 3

Start your tracking experience after a briefing in the park headquarters with packed lunch - you will get to spend one hour with the gorillas once you find them. The whole tracking takes 4 - 8 hours depending on the exact location of the gorillas. Depending on the length of your tracking and your strength, you can take a community walk in the afternoon to learn about culture and interaction with local people nearby, dinner and overnight Silverback Lodge

#### Day 4

Drive back to Kigali for your onward flight

### SILVERBACK LODGE

The lodge, situated at the foothills of the mighty Virungas Volcano chain, is tucked away in an incredible forested ecosystem. The only nine cottages feature large sitting areas, fireplaces, stylish en-suite bathrooms and a sheltered veranda. The main lodge building comprises a large, elegant sitting room with bar and fireplace. Snug reading area, souvenir shop, reception, fire side seating area, dining room and outside terrace with views of the volcanoes.



Kenya offers a beautiful collection of close to century-old golf courses. Playable all year round due to Kenya's tropical climate with courses being very natural often spotting some of local wildlife such as warthogs and antelopes trotting across the fairways. ### OL PEJETA

Located directly on the equator with the highest density of wildlife in Kenya, and the largest population of black and white rhinos in East Africa; also home to Barraka the blind and tame black rhino.

### MASAI MARA

One of the best-known reserves in the whole of Africa - comprising only 0.01% of the landmass, more than 40% of Africa's larger mammals can be found here. Across the vast plains visitors are able to witness lions, cheetahs, leopards, elephants amongst other species.

**Day 10** - Morning game drive with bush breakfast, lunch, direct flight to Mombasa, dinner and overnight at Vipingo Ridge

**Day 11, 12 & 13** - Stay at Vipingo Ridge, enjoy daily golf courses and more

**Day 14** - Transfer to Mombasa for flight

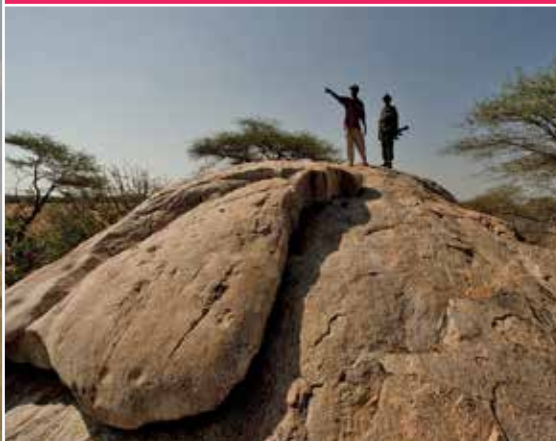
## ↑ ABERDARE COUNTRY CLUB

**SAMBURU RESERVE**

Samburu is rich in wildlife with an abundance of rare northern specialist species such as the grevy’s zebra, somali ostrich, reticulated giraffe, gerenuk and the beisa oryx. Many leopards live in the northern part, where the river flows through rocky hills and a narrow plain, There are more than 400 species of birds including the somali ostrich. You can spot lions, cheetahs, leopards and elephants.

**MASAI MARA RESERVE**

Masai Mara National Reserve covers an area of 1,510 sq km and borders Tanzanias Serengeti. The landscape varies from vast savannahs and riverine forests with clumps of the distinctive acacia trees. The Mara is an all year attraction - holding one of the highest lion densities in the world, being home to Kenya’s Big 5: elephant, buffalo, leopard, lion and rhino - amongst over 95 mammal species and 570 species of birds.

Saruni Mara is a boutique lodge with five elegant cottages, and 2 villas. The lodge is nestled in a secluded valley in Mara North Conservancy.

**↓ THE MAJI BEACH HOTEL**

The award winning luxury boutique hotel is set at Diani’s beach. The 15 rooms/suites are individually designed with luxury amenities. Facilities include an outdoor/indoor pool, a restaurant, a bar and a spa.





## KENYA'S NORTH & SOUTH COAST



### NORTH COAST

Kenya's north coast is lined with palm-tree beaches interrupted by the wide mouth of Kilifi Creek. You'll find a wide selection of world-class resorts with fine cuisine. The peaceful beach oases in Mtwapa and Takaungu offer more secluded beaches. Watamu is known for its pristine white sand beaches and reef-sheltered lagoons lining Watamu National Marine Park.

### WATAMU TREEHOUSE

Built high amongst the treetops, the hotel offers an unreal view of the Indian Ocean and lush surrounding forests. It's made up of two white stone towers, peppered with colourful panels of recycled glass, made by local artist Nani Croze. Each of the 7 rooms has its own bathroom, amazing views and it has its unique design and personal touches. Treehouse includes a pool and private beach area. Activities include yoga, massage, kayaking, snorkeling and gentle adventures in nature.

### THE SANDS AT CHALE ISLAND

The romantic resort is located on a small island 600 m off the mainland and 10 km from Diani. The resort offers several categories of accommodation, up to luxurious suites and penthouses - all rooms are equipped with TV, safe, minibar, air-condition, en-suite bathroom and balcony or veranda. Facilities include a spa, a fitness centre, 3 swimming pools, 2 bars, 2 restaurants, a diving and water-sports centre. At low tide guests can walk around the island to explore the amazing marine life.

### SOUTH COAST

The South Coast south of Mombasa is a paradise of palm fringed white sand beaches and coral reefs that have created ideal beaches with calm, inviting waters. The offshore reefs are alive with coral, myriad fish, sea turtles and dolphins. The beaches are bordered by lush green coastal rainforests with prolific birdlife and variety of wildlife including baboons, rare colobus monkeys and even leopards. Tiwi, Diani and the more secluded Galu Beach offers a good choice of hotels and holiday homes.



## LAMU ARCHIPELAGO IN KENYA



### LAMU ARCHIPELAGO

The Lamu Archipelago consists of Lamu Island, Manda Island and Pate Island. Lamu Old Town (a UNESCO World Heritage site) looks back on a history of over 700 years. The town thrives on a unique culture from the influences of its past, Portuguese explorer, Turkish and Arab traders. The only means of transport in Lamu are donkeys by road and dhows by water. Narrow streets and stone houses with impressive carved doors determine the image of Old Town.

Shela is a small village South of Lamu. You can reach Old Town by foot, donkey or boat. Shela is known for its 15 kms long and untouched beach.

Manda Island - only a few exclusive hotels and private villas to be found on the island. Takwa is an ancient Swahili village abandoned in the 17th century. The ruins are very atmospheric and surrounded by ancient baobabs. Manda Island can only be reached by boat.

### LAMU HOUSE

Lamu House is situated overlooking the Harbor in Lamu Old Town. The hotel consists of two houses that have been carefully restored to preserve the charm of traditional Swahili architecture but designed to satisfy the needs modern travellers. Lamu House offers only ten rooms. Each possesses its own character and is equipped with a spacious bathroom, a dressing room and a private terrace. There are two interior pools, a dining room and a courtyard.

### THE MAJLIS

Located directly on the beach of Manda Island - the boutique hotel is the ideal location for barefoot luxury, informal pampering and excellent cuisine. The 25 rooms and suites are divided into 3 stylish beachfront villas with common living areas. Each room is uniquely furnished - a mixture of Swahili tradition and modern design with air-condition, a generous bathroom and a private veranda. Facilities include two bars, two swimming pools, a wellness area and an activity centre.

### ZANZIBAR ARCHIPELAGO

Zanzibar consists of the two main islands: Unguja and Pemba. The capital city is Zanzibar on Unguja, with the world-famous “Stone Town”. UNESCO declared it a world heritage: “An outstanding example of the fusion of African, Arab and Indian cultures over the centuries”.

Zanzibar’s coastline offers some of the best beaches in the world. On the south coast of Zanzibar lies the Menai Bay Conservation Area, a sea turtle protection area for the endangered species that come to breed on the island. Roads to the southeast coast take visitors through the Jozani Forest, home to Zanzibar’s rare Red Colobus monkeys and other species.

### THE SEYYIDA

The Seyyida is located in the heart of Stone Town. The name “Seyyida” originates from the Arab language and means “princess”. The warm atmosphere of old Swahili elements and modern facilities give you a homely feeling. Guests can enjoy the beautiful view over Stone Town and the Indian Ocean from the rooftop terrace. 17 rooms in different categories are offered. The small boutique hotel features a rooftop restaurant, a lounge bar, a spa and a small pool.



### SULTAN SANDS ISLAND RESORT

The resort is situated on the beachfront of the wide beaches of Kiwengwa in Zanzibar's East Coast. 76 rooms are built in single storey buildings - the tastefully decorated rooms are constructed in African style. 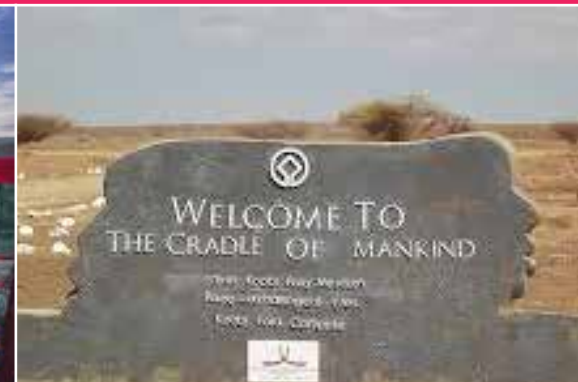
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
